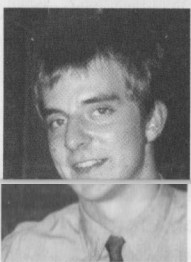
Trinity Welcomes Fellows

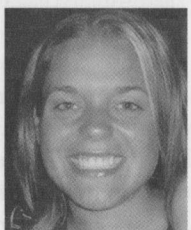

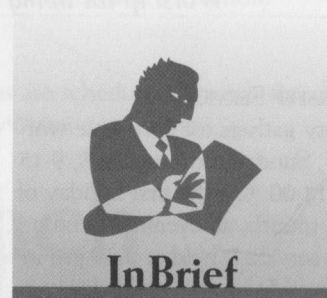

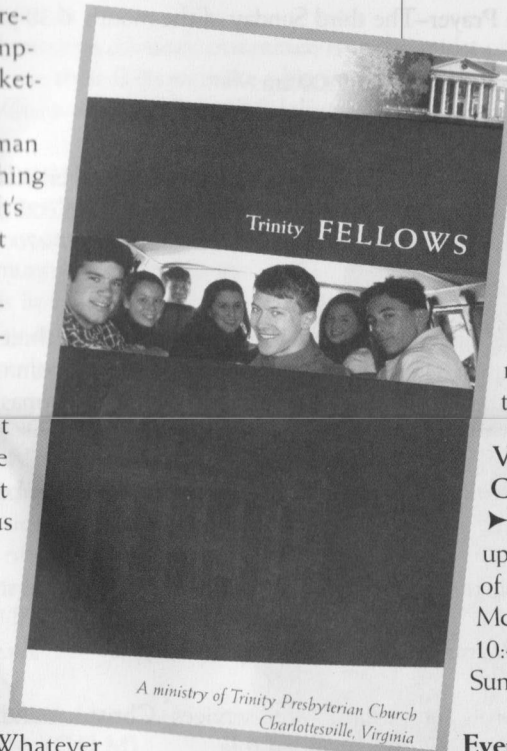
